

Safer Internet Day 2025 at Great Moor Junior School

On Tuesday, 11th February 2025, we will be celebrating Safer Internet Day at Great Moor Junior School! This year's theme is "Too Good to Be True? Protecting Yourself and Others from Scams Online", helping pupils learn how to spot and avoid online scams.

Throughout the week, pupils will take part in engaging activities to develop their awareness of online safety. Year 3 and 4 will learn how to recognise suspicious messages, websites, and pop-ups, while Year 5 and 6 will investigate common online scams and discuss how to protect personal

information. Pupils will also take part in role-playing scenarios, quizzes, and group discussions to sharpen their critical thinking skills when using the internet.

To support learning at home, we encourage families to talk about online safety together. We will also be sharing an E-Safety Parent Guide with useful tips to help protect children from scams online.

The **ZONES** of Regulation[™]




The Zones of Regulation is an internationally renowned intervention which helps children to manage and express difficult emotions. This is known as 'self-regulation'. From time to time, all of us (including adults) find it hard to manage strong feelings such as worry, anger, restlessness, fear or tiredness and this stops us from getting on with our day effectively. The Zones of Regulation aims to teach children strategies to help them cope with these feelings so they can get back to feeling calm and ready to learn. At Great Moor Junior School, we use the Zones of Regulation throughout the whole school.
