Key knowledge

Understand what a landscape is.

Be aware of landscape artists - Derain, Monet, O'Keefe, Turner, Lawrence and Adnan and their unique style of painting. Know some details about one of these artists - Nationality, gender, and be able to recognise their paintings and style of painting.

Recap on sketch and paint skills covered in Year 4 & 5 (refer to prior knowledge organisers.) Know the effect of a range of media (watercolours, oil paint, chalk, pastels, print) and different mark making/brushstrokes (stippling, long, short, circular motion)

Know that **colours** and brushstrokes can create **feelings**. To be considerate when choosing colours.

Know understand perspective-background, foreground, middle ground and where to a position horizon line.

To know about the golden ratio/divine proportion and how it can help when drawing landscapes.

To reflect on artists work using precise vocabulary.











Key vocabulary

Landscape - a picture representing an area of land watercolour - water soluble paint oil paint - thick paint made of ground pigment and oil chalk - a soft limestone used for drawing/colouring pastels - made of powdered pigments and resin horizon line - where the sky and land look like they meet. style - characteristic way of painting subdued colours - soft, toned down

golden ratio/divine proportion - a 1:2 ratio that is visually pleasing to the eye.

artificial colours - colours that don't exist in nature,

natural colours - colours that exist in nature
